Romans 16:17-23 May 12, 2016

:17-19 I. Oppose schismatics

:17a A. Watch out for them.

¹⁷ I appeal to you, brothers, to watch out for those who cause divisions and create obstacles contrary to the doctrine that you have been taught; ...

- ♦ Moral relativism → pragmatism → denial of conscience (erosion of sexual ethic)
