5:22 I. God has given His covenant in great glory.

A. He spoke His Word.

"These words the Lord spoke...with a loud voice...and he wrote on two tablets of stone...." cf. Hebrews 1:1-4; Matthew 7:28, 29; John 7:46

B. He displayed His glory.

"...out of the midst of the fire, the cloud, and the thick darkness...." cf. Hebrews 12:18-29; John 5:36; 10:25, 38; 14:11; 15:24; 12:20-43

:23-31 II. God has given His faithful covenant mediator.

:23-26 A. God's nearness inspires reverent fear.

"...God has shown...we have heard..." "...this great fire will consume us..."
"If we hear the voice of the Lord our God any more, we shall die. For who is there of all flesh that has heard the voice of the living God speaking out of the midst of fire as we have, and has still lived?"

cf. Exodus 3:6; Isaiah 6:1-8; Luke 2:9; Matthew 17:6; Mark 16:8; Revelation 1:17

B. Our reverent fear seeks a mediator.

"Go near and hear...and speak to us...and we will hear and do it." cf. Job 9:33; Deuteronomy 18:18

:28-31 C. God is pleased.

"I have heard...they are right...."

1. He commends our motive.

"Oh that they had such a mind as this always, to fear me...."

The Fear of God - There are over 150 references to the fear of God in the Bible. The fear of God is the appropriate human reaction to the revelation of God, for He is great and glorious and awesome in His being and in His works. Our fear of God consists of our amazement, our adoration, and our submission to God. It does not consist of slavish, untrusting, or begrudging fear. The fear of God enables us to enjoy God and life itself, because:

- 1. It is the beginning of knowledge and wisdom. cf. Proverbs 1:7; 9:10
- 2. It is the fountain of life. cf. Proverbs 14:27
 - a. our walk cf. Exo 20:20; I Peter 2:17; Acts 9:31; Isa 11:1-3; II Cor 7:1; Romans 3:18 John Calvin: All wickedness flows from a disregard for God...since the fear of God is the bridle by which our wickedness is held in check, its removal frees us to indulge in every kind of licentious conduct.
 - b. our work cf. Ephesians 6:5; Colossians 3:22; Proverbs 15:16-17
 - c. our witness cf. Ezekiel 1:28; Isaiah 6:8; Matthew 10:26-33; Luke 5:1-11; II Cor 5:11
 - d. our worship cf. Malachi 1:6-14; Psalm 96:4; Hebrews 12:28, 29
 - e. our wives cf. Proverbs 31:30; Ephesians 5:21
