## 1:1, 2a I. Galatians was written by Paul.

**1:1** A. Paul was an apostle.

"Paul, an apostle..."

- 1. Sent by God, not by men
  - "...sent not from men nor by a man, but by Jesus Christ and God the Father, Who raised him from the dead..."
  - cf. Mark 3:14; Luke 6:13; Acts 26:15-20
- 2. Eye witness
  - cf. I Corinthians 15:5-8
- 3. Worker of signs, wonders, and miracles
  - cf. II Corinthians 12:12
- **1:2a** B. Paul was a brother.

"...and all the brothers with me..."

## 1:2b II. Galatians was written to Christians in Galatia.

"To the Christians in Galatia..." cf. Acts 13, 14

## 1:3-5 III. Galatians was written about the gospel.

A. The motivation of the gospel is the grace of God.

"Grace...to you..."

cf. Luke 15

- B. The effect of the gospel is the peace of God.
  - "...and peace...from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ..."
  - cf. Rom. 5:1, 2; Phil. 4:6, 7; John 14:27; Jeremiah 29:7; Isa. 26:3; Eph. 2:14
- C. The heart of the gospel is the substitutionary death of Christ.
  - "...who gave himself for our sins..."
  - cf. Rom. 3:21-26; Gal. 3:13
- D. The work of the gospel is to rescue sinners.
  - "...to rescue us from the present evil age..."
  - cf. II Tim. 2:25, 26; Rev. 1:5
- E. The source of the gospel is the decree of God.
  - "...according to the will of our God and Father..."
  - cf. I Peter 1:20; Eph. 1:3-5, 9, 11
- F. The purpose of the gospel is to glorify God.
  - "...to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen."

cf. Eph. 1:3, 6, 12, 14
